



## Reminder:

Dorval is modernizing the collection of residual materials as part of its ecological transition and efforts to optimize municipal services.



## Environmental and Economic Goals

- **Improved cleanliness image of the City:** By targeting a specific week each month for collections, the cityscape remains cleaner and free of various waste the rest of the month.
- **Decrease in greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions:** Fewer trucks on the road means less fuel burned, resulting in a reduced carbon footprint.
- **Compliance with Montreal Agglomeration requirements:** Dorval aligns with regional objectives for residual materials management and with the Environment Quality Act.
- **Reduction of landfill waste:** By limiting collections to one week per month, Dorval encourages residents to sort better and recover more materials.
- **Cost reduction:** Collection-related expenses have dropped from \$1 million to \$300,000 — a major gain for municipal finances.



## Service Improvement

- **Targeted monthly collection:** One pickup per residence, one week per month, allows for better planning and efficiency.
- **Easier access to the Public Works yard drop-off:** Open one Saturday per month to accommodate residents' schedules.
- **Various recovery options:** Ecocentres, GoRecycle program, municipal drop-off, etc.



## Current Situation

- 6% increase in visits to ecocentres since 2023;
- Dorval generates five times more construction, renovation, and demolition (CRD) waste than the Agglomeration average, which justifies stricter management;
- Better sorting = increased subsidies from the Agglomeration linked to Dorval's local residual materials management (currently \$1.79 per resident in Dorval vs. \$13 per resident in other cities).

In summary, this modernization aims to build a **cleaner, greener, and more responsible city**, while keeping citizens' **tax bills stable** through efficient resource management.
