



Excerpt of the minutes of the council meeting held on Monday, January 17, 2022

1b Question Period and Receipt of Petitions

1. A resident of Allard Avenue expresses his dissatisfaction with the services provided by the contractor who collects the **waste materials**, and asks: 1) what measures will be undertaken by the City to reduce **damages made to garbage bins**; and 2) whether the City could index the \$50 given to residents for bins damaged by the contractor.

2. A resident of Place Fortin deplores the **closure of the pool** at the Aquatic and Sports Complex and asks: 1) to know the reasons that led the council to take this decision despite the fact that this measure was not required by the Government of Quebec; 2) asks if the City could provide data on the impact on employees affected by a **temporary layoff** as a result of the closure of the recreational facilities between December 22, 2021 and January 17, 2022; and 3) requests that the council justify the decision to **close the showers**.

3. A resident of Martin Avenue asks: whether the City has recognized the heritage value of **St-Charles Park** and whether households adjacent to the park have been consulted about the redevelopment project.

4. A resident of McNicoll Crescent asks: 1) whether the City will invite competitive bids for the **playground equipment at St-Charles Park**, what specifications will be required, and how many companies will be invited to bid; 2) what steps can be taken by the City to change the zoning of the **Champs des Monarques** area at **Golf Dorval** and protect this green space; and 3) requests clarification on item 6 e) on the agenda as to why lots **6 486 278** and **6 486 279** are being sold, to whom they are being sold, and whether bids were solicited through a bidding process.

5. A resident of St-Charles Avenue asks: 1) why the City purchased an industrial land but did not purchase the land at **45 St-Charles** to allow its citizens to benefit from it; 2) why the **Director General** does not represent the municipality at hearings held before the *Commission d'accès à l'information* in order to save taxpayers money; and 3) why the council approved the plans for **45 St-Charles**, when the submitted project does not meet all the requirements of the municipality's Site Planning and Architectural Integration Program by-law.

6. Residents of the St-Charles Park area ask: 1) to be given confirmation that citizens will be able to contribute and give their opinion during the consultation for the **St-Charles Park** project; 2) whether the council will take appropriate measures to preserve the peacefulness of the park and ensure that it is free from disturbance in light of the requested **archaeological potential** study of the site; and 3) if the City can confirm that **sustainable benches** without concrete bases will be installed in the park.

7. A resident of Ducharme Avenue asks: 1) whether the City will honour the "Area of Interest" status of the **St-Charles Park** neighbourhood, as set out in the Sustainable Master Plan; 2) if the City can guarantee that the mature trees in the front yard of **260 Ducharme Avenue** will not be cut down; and 3) that all councillors will become familiar with the **Sustainable Master Plan**.

8. A resident of Ducharme Avenue asks: 1) whether the council would be willing to hold **council meetings via Zoom** to allow people to participate live; and 2) if it is possible to have access to the documents showing the process undertaken by the municipality to acquire the **Pointe Picard** marina.

9. A resident of Neptune Boulevard asks: 1) whether the council may request that **CCU members** consent to the public disclosure of their *curriculum vitae*; 2) whether the archaeological potential of **St-Charles Park** will be assessed prior to any excavation work, particularly in the area near the water; and 3) whether the council can approve his recommendation to mandate the presence of an **archaeological expert** during any excavation work that will take place as part of the project.

10. A resident of chemin du Bord-du-Lac–Laskeshore requests that the **Sustainable Master Plan**, or at least a quick link to it, be highlighted on the home page of the City's website.

11. A resident of Clément Avenue notes that the **Christmas tree collection** seemed less effective this year than last and suggests that for next year: 1) there be a minimum of two pick-up dates; and 2) that the information be published on the website and in the electronic newsletter.
